A The Book of Kells

Since the 1980s, Grafton Street has become internationally known for its street entertainment, particularly busking. Musicians, poets, and mime artists commonly perform to the shopping crowds.

C Dublin Castle

Built in the 13th century by King John of England. It served as a military fortress, prison, treasury, and court of law for 700 years. Today it is used for important State events.
