## Tips from Non-native English Students to Get You Your First Job

### EXAMPLE:

*To help gain confidence in interviewing skills, you should practice the interview process and work on listening and speaking skills. Think of how you would answer some typical questions. Then find a friend who can ask you the questions and keep practicing every day until you can “think on your feet”.*

### PARAGRAPH 1

How to say things in an interview is just as important as what you say. Do a self-assessment. Are there some letters, sounds or words that are difficult for you and that you would like to use in the interview? Work on these or find suitable words to substitute.

### PARAGRAPH 2

Instead of memorizing answers, it is important to anticipate certain questions and think of how you might answer them. However, it is advisable to not sound like you have memorized the answers to the questions. The content of the answer is important to remember, not the exact words.

### PARAGRAPH 3

Show up for your interview about 10-15 minutes ahead of time. Make sure you know where to go. Call for directions or look online so there will be no unexpected delay in finding where the interview will be.

### PARAGRAPH 4

You should greet the interviewer by shaking hands and saying *Hello* or *Good morning* or even the phrase *Nice to meet you*. Address them with the appropriate title (Mr./Miss/Ms./Mrs./Dr.) and the last name.

### PARAGRAPH 5

You should look at the person during the interview. If there is more than one person interviewing you, it is important to look at all of the people in the interview panel.

## **LONDON SPOTS**

### **Cleopatra's Needle**

Named after the ancient Egyptian queen Cleopatra, this 21m high granite obelisk was a gift to Britain from the Egyptian government. It was brought to London in 1878 on a specially designed ship. Six sailors died in the voyage. The monument is almost 3,500 years old and it's inscribed with Egyptian hieroglyphs.

### **Tate Modern**

This vast old power station has been transformed into one of London's largest and most popular art galleries, displaying modern art from all over the world. Inside you'll find paintings, sculptures and photographs by almost every famous artist from the past hundred years.

### **Cabinet War Rooms**

As enemy bombs fell on London during the Second World War, Prime Minister Winston Churchill and his government met in safety in this secret headquarters 3m below the streets of Westminster. Today, the war Rooms have been recreated so you can see how they looked at the time.

### **Smithfield Market**

Meat has been bought and sold at Smithfield Market for almost 1,000 years. The current market building, with its iron arches and domed towers, opened in 1868. Animals aren't killed here any more, but it still supplies meat to restaurants all over London.

### **Temple Bar**

For over 200 years, this grand stone arch stood in Fleet Street, as one of the official gateways to the City (the financial heart of London). In the middle of the 19th century, Fleet Street had to be widened for extra traffic, so Temple Bar was dismantled. In 2003, the gateway was re-erected where it now stands, close to St. Paul's Cathedral.
