TRANSCRIPT (Going to a Resturant)

Josh:	Yes, there's (Sentence 0) a really great chicken restaurant near my house.

Josh:	Yeah, (Sentence 1) they have lots of different types of chicken . They have fried chicken, baked chicken, broiled chicken, and so on.
Shirley:	Hmm, chicken. You know, (Sentence 2) I don't really like chicken that much. Do you know about somewhere else, somewhere that doesn't have chicken or beef?
Josh:	Yes, there's (Sentence 3) a vegetarian restaurant near my house, too. But it's in the opposite direction.
Shirley:	Great. Okay, what kind of food do they have?
Josh:	They have lots of salads, fresh salads. And they also have some stir-fry.
Shirley:	Okay, and what's the restaurant like?
Josh:	The restaurant is really nice. (Sentence 4) It's pretty small, and there's not a lot people usually.
Shirley:	Okay. Is it light or dark inside the restaurant?
Josh:	It's a little bit dark but the food is really good.
Shirley:	Okay. What about the tables? Do they have tablecloths or do they not have tablecloths?
Josh:	(Sentence 5) There's no tablecloths and the tables are a little bit low.
Shirley:	What about the price of the food? Is it expensive or is it cheap?
Josh:	It's very cheap.
Shirley:	Hmm, that's good.
Josh:	Yeah. For example, you can buy a salad for only 5 dollars.
Shirley:	Wow. (Sentence 6) That is cheap.
Josh:	It is.
Shirley:	Okay. What about a soup?
Josh:	A soup is usually 6 dollars but they're really good.
Shirley:	Okay. Well, I have my car today, so is there parking at the restaurant?
Josh:	(Sentence 7) There's some parking but there's actually a lot nearby.
Shirley:	Okay, so no problem to park my car.
Josh:	It's no problem.
Shirley:	Great. Then, let's go for vegetarian.
Josh:	Okay, sounds great.

TRANSCRIPT (*Interview*)

- I: I'm talking to Matt, (0) who's a teacher. Hi Matt.
- M: Hello.
- I: Matt, tell me first about the school you teach in. What kind of school is it?
- M: It's a school in England and (Gap 1) it's a private school, so the students have to pay to go there.
- I: Is that a primary school or a secondary school?
- M: It's a secondary school, the pupils are 13 to 18.
- I: Is it boys, girls or mixed?
- M: It's mixed, both boys and girls.
- I: Am I right in saying you're an English language teacher?
- M: That's right, (Gap 2) I teach English as a foreign language.
- I: A foreign language in an English school? That sounds a bit strange.
- M: Yes, but we have quite a lot of pupils who come from overseas and **(Gap3) their first language isn't English**.
- I: Which country do the pupils come from?
- M: We have quite a lot from Europe, a lot from Germany, Spain, and also from Russia, China, Japan, all over the world.
- I: Why do you have so many foreign pupils at school?
- M: They want tocome (Gap 4) to have a British education . And quite often they want to stay in the UK to go to university after school.
- I: Right. Do you have a typical day at school?
- M: I do. I usually arrive in my classroom at about 8:00.
- I: The classes start at 8:00?
- M: The classes start at 8:45 but I arrive about 8:00 and sort of plan my day and have a look at what's happening. (Gap 5) I teach two fifty-five-minute lessons. Then, there's a half hour break. Then another two fifty-five-minute lessons. Then there's lunch. Sometimes in the afternoon another two lessons but on Sundays there would be sports and activities in the afternoon so no lessons.
- I: You teach on a Sunday? You work on a Sunday?
- M: I do often work on a Sunday, (Gap6) we do teach on a Saturday so the pupils have lessons six days a week butthere's no teaching on a Sunday.
- I: So how come you're there seven days a week?
- M: Because (Gap 7) the students live at the school. It's a boarding school.
- I: Ah, it's not a day school.
- M: That's right. They're there all the time so there are activities in the evenings and the weekends that require teachers to be there and, and I have to go in and do all sorts of different things.
