Finnish panda expert Anna Palmroth said the 6,500-kilometer flight from Chengdu, China to Helsinki went well. She said the pandas spent most of the time sleeping and eating bamboo, carrots and apples.

Then, the pandas began a trip to the Ahtari Zoo nature reserve in central Finland, about 330 kilometres north of Helsinki. The Ahtari Zoo specializes in animals from the north of Europe. The zoo will have the giant pandas for 15 years. It has built a special Panda House because they hope they will receive more visitors. The building project cost nearly 8 million euros. The Associated Press reports that the cold weather in Ahtari was similar to conditions in China's mountain areas.

Chinese President Xi Jinping offered Finnish President Sauli Niinisto the two pandas in April 2017. For more than half a century, the Chinese government has used "panda diplomacy" as a sign of closer relations with other countries.

In 1972, the United States received two giant pandas after U.S. President Richard Nixon's historic visit to China. More than 1 million people came to see the pandas during their first year at the National Zoo in Washington, D.C.
