Elizabeth Blackwell

Elizabeth Blackwell, M.D. (1821-1910), was born in England on February 3, 1821, the third of nine children, at a time when women couldn't go to university or have independent jobs, and married women couldn't do anything without their husbands.

Elizabeth's early home life was rich and happy for her and her brothers and sisters. Both boys and girls had teachers at home. Their parents usually had dinner parties with guests who talked about important things with the children.

At age 24, she wrote in her diary that she was bored with the study of music and philosophy. She decided to study medicine and wrote to different universities until she found one in New York that let women study there.

She was the first woman to go to university to study medicine in the United States and she is America's first woman doctor.

She opened many hospitals and helped women become doctors. She changed the history of medicine in the United States and England.
