TEST 3: PLANS FOR THE WEEKEND	Instructions for the candidate: There is a long holiday coming –Friday, Saturday & Sunday - and you don't have any plans. Someone from work suggests that you go away together. Talk to your workmate about plans for the long weekend. Instructions for the examiner: You work for a company. There is a long holiday coming (Friday, Saturday and Sunday) and you have no plans. Ask your workmate whether s/he would like to do something with you. Choose the items from the list that best correspond to what the candidate says in each moment. It is not necessary to use all the questions and the order is not fixed. The task finishes when the allotted time is up. ▪ Greet the candidate and start the conversation. ▪ Elicit the following information: ▪ Are you doing anything this long weekend? ▪ What would you like to do? The long weekend starts on Friday. ▪ The weather is going to be good. ▪ How about going to the mountains/ to the beach, etc.? ▪ How much money can you afford/spend? ▪ Where shall we stay? Why don't we go camping? ▪ What equipment/clothes shall we take? ▪ How would you like to travel – by car, train, coach, plane etc.? Finish the conversation in a suitable way. <i>Suggestion: We'll have a great weekend.</i>
TEST 4: AT THE AIRPORT	Instructions for the candidate: You are going to spend a week in New York. You arrive at John F. Kennedy International airport. The customs officer is going to ask you a few routine questions at the passport control. Talk to the customs officer. Instructions for the examiner: You work as a customs officer at John F. Kennedy International airport. A Spanish traveler arrives at the passport control and you start asking some routine questions. Can I have your address? ▪ What are you going to visit? ▪ How much money did you bring with you? ▪ Do you plan to buy anything? Finish the conversation in a suitable way. <i>Suggestion: Have a good day and enjoy your holiday in New York.</i>
