A hundred years ago, you could not buy or consume alcoholic drinks in the United States. It was the age of "prohibition", and a time when criminals controlled a whole industry(0-C). The most famous gangster was Al Capone.

America is the land of Liberty. You can think what you want to think, and you can say what you want to say; but you cannot always do what you want to do without breaking the law.(1-C)

Today you cannot use hard drugs, because it is against the law. The law has decided that drugs are dangerous, and most people believe that the law is right. Today, in many places, you cannot smoke a cigarette in the street. But today, you can sit in a bar and drink a beer just as long as you are not below the age limit (2-A); a hundred years ago, you could not. America was dry. Alcohol was illegal. You could neither drink it nor make it, nor buy it, nor import it, nor sell it.

If you did, you could go to prison.

Alcohol became illegal in the year 1919; it remained illegal for fourteen years. However, it never disappeared! Before 1919 alcoholic drinks were very popular in the United States. There was a big drinks industry, which employed a great number of people. Suddenly, in 1919, the industry had to stop!

Of course, it could not stop. It stopped officially, but it continued to prosper unofficially. In place of big business, there was big crime. The Mafia took control of the distribution, and the bosses of the Mafia replaced the bosses of the breweries and the distilleries.(3-C)

The biggest gangster of them all was Al Capone, who came from New York and operated in Chicago. Capone controlled a vast empire of crime (4-B). He was so powerful that he could control anyone he wanted to. He could "buy" policemen, he could "buy" politicians. He was "untouchable" (5-B). In his fortress at Chicago, he was quite safe, because he was a friend of the Mayor, "Big" Bill Thompson.

Big Bill liked Capone, because he liked his drink. Bill and his drinking friends in the authorities made sure that Capone did not have much trouble (6-B). Capone had lots of enemies, but most of his enemies were frightened of him. They knew that Al could kill them, and would kill them, if they were not careful.

Most policemen were very careful not to get in the way of Al Capone, unless they had to. Most policemen, but not all. A small group of policemen, known as "the Untouchables", were determined that Al Capone would not escape from justice for ever (7-B). They took several years to do their work, but in the end they succeeded. Al Capone was finally sent to prison.(8-A)

However, he was never accused of killing, nor of selling alcohol. He was too clever for that. No evidence could incriminate him for that (9-C). He was sent to prison for not paying taxes.(10-C)

A very interesting event happened (0) DURING the 1986 football World Cup in Mexico. (1) ON June 22, Argentina and England played against each other in the semifinals. ST VALENTINE'S DAY

The United States celebrates Valentine's Day each year on February 14. Images of hearts are everywhere, as are red roses and boxes of chocolates to give to that special person. (0-C) You could say that "love is in the air."

Many other countries celebrate Valentine's Day, too, each in their own way. Here is a look at four countries' Valentine's Day traditions.

South Korea: three is a charm

For South Koreans, Valentine's Day happens in three parts: February 14, March 14 and April 14. (1-C)

On February 14, women traditionally give men gifts of chocolate to show their affection. (2-A) One month later, on a holiday known as White Day, men show their thanks by giving women a sweet gift. (3-B) The name "White Day" comes from the mostly outdated custom of giving white-colored gifts.

And, let's not forget Black Day on April 14. Single people who did not get gifts on February 14 or March 14 often gather on Black Day to eat Jjajangmyeon noodles with black bean sauce. (4-C)

Wales: land o' love spoons

Unlike many European countries, Wales does not celebrate Saint Valentine. It has its own Saint of Love. Her name is Saint Dwynwen. (5-B) The Welsh holiday is called St. Dwynwen's Day and takes place on January 25.

The traditional romantic gift on this day is a love spoon. (6-C) Beginning in the 17th century, Welsh men carved beautiful wooden spoons as a representation of their love for that special person in their lives. Each **pattern** has a different meaning. For example, horseshoes mean good luck; **keys** represent the key to a man's heart; and wheels are a sign of support.

Today in Wales, love spoons are also given at weddings, births and other celebrations.

Argentina: a week of sweets

Argentina celebrates Valentine's Day in February, but also gives a whole other week to love in July. They call it Sweetness Week. If you kiss someone, they have to give you a sugary treat. (7-B)

Sweetness Week started in 1989 with a candy company called Arcor. (8-C) They made an advertisement called "Candy for a Kiss." The idea was to give the company's chocolates and other candies in exchange for a sweet kiss on the cheek. The campaign had a stronger effect than the company expected -- it led to a new holiday!

Every July, couples who take part give each other candies and kisses all week long.

United States: female friends

Finally, we turn to the United States.

Galentine's Day, February 13, began as a made-up holiday on an American television show, *Parks and Recreation*(9-B). In one part of the show in 2010, the show's main **character**, Leslie Knope, said Galentine's Day is about "ladies celebrating ladies "(10-B). So, the day is a celebration of friendship between women.

THE MOST STRESSFUL JOBS

Recently, my nine-year-old son proudly announced to me that he wanted to become a commercial airline pilot when he grows up. I'm happy for him because he spends hours reading books about airplanes (0), and he loves to play airplane game apps (1).

It's great to know what career you want at such a young age. As well, the average annual salary for an airline pilot is quite good: US\$105.270 (2). Also, being an airline pilot means that you might travel to many exotic locations around the world (3), places that most people might never get a chance to see.

However, I wonder if his choice of career (4) is one that I should encourage. You see, this morning I googled (5) "most stressful jobs" and I discovered that my son's dream career is actually the third most stressful job on a list of top ten most stressful jobs. This makes sense because as a pilot you are responsible for the lives of hundreds (6) of people, you are away from home for many days at a time, and you may have to fly through many different time zones which can be very difficult (7) to adjust to. Number one on the list was "military personnel" (soldier) and number two was "firefighter" (8). Of course, jobs like these are very dangerous (9) - you must put your life in danger almost daily. Interestingly, however, "taxi driver" (10) was also on the list (at number ten).
