TASK 1. LEONARDO DA VINCI (TRANSCRIPCIÓN)

Today we tell about one of the greatest **0 Example. THINKERS** in the world, Leonardo DaVinci. He began his career as an artist, but his interest in the world around him drove him to study music, math, science, engineering and **1. BUILDING** design. Many of his ideas and inventions were **2. CENTURIES** ahead of his time.

We start with one of Leonardo DaVinci's most famous drawings called Vitruvian man. This work is a good example of his ever questioning mind and his effort to bring **3. TOGETHER** art, math, and science. Vitruvian man is a detailed sketch of a man's body, which is drawn at the centre of a square and circle. The man's stretched arms and legs are in two **4. POSITIONS** showing the range of his motion, his arms and legs touch the edges of the square and circle.

With this drawing, Leonardo was considering the size of the human body and its relationship to **5**. **GEOMETRY** and the writings of the ancient Roman building designer Vitruvius. Leonardo wrote this about how to develop a complete mind: *"study the science of art, study the art of science, develop your 6.SENSES, especially learn how to see,* **7**. **REALISE** that everything connects to everything else."

Leonardo DaVinci spent his life studying and observing in order to develop a scientific understanding of the world. He wrote down his thoughts and **8. PROJECT** ideas in a series of small notebooks. He made drawings and explain them with **9. DETAILED** notes. In these notebooks, he would write the words backwards. Some experts say he wrote this way because he wished to be secretive about his findings but others say he wrote this way because he was **10. LEFT-HANDED**. And writing backwards was easier and helped keep the ink from smearing.

My real parents lived on another island. Our village is called Vaipaka and our house is a little bit back from the road that goes through the village by the hill.

TEXT 3. MARK TWAIN

Mark Twain – **0D (example) WROTE** - "The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn" in 1884. – **1A. SINCE** - then, the book has been published in at least sixty languages. Some people say it is the best book – **2C. EVER** - created by an American writer. American students still read "The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn" and parents, teachers and literary experts still debate the issues discussed in the book.

The writer who became Mark Twain was born Samuel Langhorne Clemens in 1835. He grew up in Hannibal, Missouri on the Mississippi River.

- **3B. LATER** -, he wrote funny stories and called himself Mark Twain. Twain became famous for his story, "The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County" in 1865. It tells about a jumping competition among frogs.

Twain also travelled a lot and began writing books about his travels. His stories about a trip to Europe and the Middle East – **4B. WERE PUBLISHED** - in "The Innocents Abroad." And his stories about life in the western United States became the book called "Roughing It."

In 1870, he married Olivia Langdon and moved to Hartford, Connecticut. During the 1880's, he wrote books for children, **- 5A. SUCH AS -** "The Prince and the Pauper." It tells about a poor boy who trades identities with a member of England's ruling family. Twain also wrote "Life on the Mississippi." This book describes his days as a steamboat pilot and his return to the river twenty years later.

Mark Twain was – 6D. ALREADY - a successful writer before he became famous as a public speaker. Over the years, he had invested a lot of money in unsuccessful businesses. In 1893, he found himself deeply in debt. So to earn money, he traveled around the world giving humorous talks. His speeches – 7B. MADE - people laugh and remember events they had experienced.

However, his later life was not a happy one. Two of his daughters died. His wife died in 1904 after a long sickness. Some critics think Mark Twain's later works were more serious **– 8A. BECAUSE OF -** his sadness. He died of heart failure in 1910.
