TASK 1- The future of our food.

Colin, what is the single biggest change our audience here and at home will notice in the food world in the next 30 years or so?

Well, if we go on as we are of course there will be very little change except that it will get worse but if we have a radical change of policy and the way we do things and if we really set out seriously to provide good food for everybody, which as far as I know has never actually been done, then, it could be done. And we could have the finest cuisine to everybody in the world.

Professor Charles Godfray. I think we are going to see food prices more expensive. I think we are going to see food prices more variable. Especially, as the effects of climate change begin to become felt. I think, we as a society will be eating less meat and, sticking my neck out, I think, we'll have the option of eating cultured meat, artificial meat and I really don't know whether we'll take up that option or not.

Thank you, Christine. I am certain that there will be a big change in how the food actually gets to us. We may get to the point when you are opening the fridge door and it already will have been been stocked from the other side of the world or it might be arriving by drones but I think, how food does the final mile-will be very different.

Sean. We are on the cusp of a biotechnological revolution. There'll be as much change in the next 30 years, as far as farming and food is concerned, as there has been in your lives and in your businesses lives as a result of information and communication technology. The industry will become much more overtly science and technologically driven and I hope much more professional and efficient.

And Tristam. I think, unfortunately, Sean is probably right. We don't have the mechanisms that we actually need in place to change the food system in the way that we have to. I think, we'll continue to see deforestation in South America and South East Asia being executed in order to produce more food for us in rich countries and, unfortunately, that's going to contribute to the biohazards that we are experiencing right now, like climate change.

Well, that leads very nicely into one of the contexts for this conversation: if growing wealth of the world and population were not challenge for our food system enough there is more, climate change, is happening and no one is immune, so says the intergovernmental panel on climate change in its most

recent report and they go on, all aspects of food security are potentially affected by climate change and over the last few years *Costing the Earth* has reported frequently on this rising tide of concern.

On the one hand we've got rising populations, mouths to feed, on the other hand we've got actually the climate that may be deteriorating in terms of ability to grow food.

Food production now is getting more and more expensive, there is not enough land available on this planet.

If the rural population is going to increase to 9 billion in 2050 then we need another earth.

We've never had a supply problem. Ok, prices might go up in The United States but we've never had a supply problem with corn and it is getting serious enough now, I think, where some of the large growers (...)they are a little fearful that there will even be a supply of corn this winter.

TASK 2-Interview with Jaden Smith

C: Hey, guys, I'm Christinne Gibson, for Cambio, and we are here for a very special couch session with the one and only Jaden Smith! Hey, Jaden.

J: Thank you for having me.

C: Thank you so much for being here. We're gonna be taking questions live on Twitter so send yours by using the hashtag #jadencambioae, for "After Earth", your new movie that's coming out, so, let's get right to it, shall we?

J: Yes!

C: OK, this question is from Misfit Society. They wanna know what great advice can you give to an actor your age who wants to get into the business or music industry.

J: Mmm. I would say to them, 'cause this is what I do, I basically, oh, talk to all of my friends all the time about acting, and I love to give people like inspirational talks, so I would say, you have to really, really know that's what you wanna do and you can't like change your mind later, this is not gonna happen overnight, and you really just need to, really be dedicated about it and really like decide right now that's what you're gonna do for the rest of your life, 'cause the only way you're gonna succeed is if you're working the hardest out of everybody in the world, 'cause there's really hundreds of other people, actually millions of other people who are trying to do the same exactly as you're doing right now. That's what I would say.

C: So it's all about hard work and dedication.

- J: It's all about hard work and dedication. It's just you have to want it more than everyone else.
- C: I love that, that's great advice. We have another question from (...). They wanna know who is your best friend.
- J: Ah, Moises and Mateo would be my best friends.
- C: Tell us about them.
- J: They, ah, they run the Misfit brand with me, and we've kind of been friends for four years, they sleep at my house like every single night, we go out skating together and stuff, if you ¿check us? on Vine, you'll see a video, our first Vine, Mateo's trying to nose stall a table in a hotel room, and some interesting things happen after that.
- C: And you've actually brought your skateboard with you today
- J: Yeah, I did. They made me not have it, they made me not bring it in here, though, I thought it wasn't professional if I brought it over here. I would though.
- C: We'll see that for another time. Right, this question is from Baby Brooklyn, they wanna know how would you describe your dad's attitude and mindset when it comes to acting.
- J: I would describe my dad's attitude in life as just driven, and, that's how he basically does everything, if it's acting, rapping, or writing or running, he's just driven, and he's gonna get to the, where he said he was gonna get to, no matter what, like if he, if he says he's gonna run five miles, he's gonna run five miles, even if he like throws up everywhere, that's why he was, he is so successful, my dad is.
- C: I think he's passed it on to you too.
- J: Oh, thank you.
- C: Here's another one, from (...). What's the most embarassing thing that's ever happened to you?
- J: I've never got that. Nor have I ever had to think about it.
- C: Now's the time.
- J: Yeah! The most embarrassing thing that happened to me, the most embarrassing thing that has ever happened. I'm kind of always surrounded by people I'm comfortable with, so it's hard to get embarrassed around like if you're just around your family and friends, but it was pretty embarrassing when my dad tried to kiss me on the mouth in public...
- C: Oh, man, that is bad
- J: Yeah. That's pretty embarrassing. We were in Korea. He tried to kiss me on my mouth in a press conference, he tried to make a heart with our hands, like this, I was against that

as well, and then he tried to kiss me, and I almost flipped the couch over. So that was a good time.

C: I think it's sweet that your dad loves you so much.

J: Yeah, I appreciate the love but there's a time and a place to kiss me.

C: I got it, I got it. Right, here is another one from (...) They wanna know what was the most challenging thing about the making of "After Earth".

J: The most challenging thing about the making of "After Earth" was probably the emotional scene at the heart of the movie with me and my dad. That's probably the most challenging part about making the movie. That part was like, I don't know, I just, I try to avoid emotional scenes as much as possible.
