How to protect yourself from Street robbery



Look confident

You are less likely to be targeted if you look confident. Move with purpose and try to be aware of your surroundings.

Know where you're going

Plan your route and think about what to take with you. Keep to busy, well-lit streets which are more likely to be covered by CCTV. Only take licensed taxis or minicabs booked in advance.

Hide it

Keep your valuables out of sight. If you're using your phone it's more likely to be snatched from your hand as you're not paying attention to your surroundings.

Never leave a mobile, wallet or purse on the table of an outdoor café or restaurant. Same goes for any jewellery you might be wearing – keep it covered when walking down the street.

Finally, if you're threatened with violence, don't risk your personal safety. Property can be replaced, you can't.

The Principles of Crime Prevention

- 1. Target Hardening: Making your property harder for an offender to access.
- Upgrading the locks on your doors and windows.
- Using secure passwords to prevent criminals hacking your online accounts.
- 2. Target Removal: Ensuring that a potential target is out of view.
- Not leaving items on view through your windows i.e. laptops, phones, keys,
- o Not leaving valuables on display in your car.
- Being cautious about what you post online as it may be used to identify or locate you offline.
- **3. Reducing the Means**: Removing items that may help commit an offence.
- Not leaving tools and ladders in the garden and clearing up any bricks.
- o Keeping wheelie bins out of reach as they may be a climbing aid.
- 4. Surveillance: Improving surveillance around homes,
- Removing high fences at the front of your home that allows an offender to work unseen
- Establishing a Neighbourhood Watch Scheme in your street
