Obtienes: 1 punto por cada respuesta correcta; 0 puntos por cada respuesta incorrecta o no dada.
 - En la tarea 2 vas a escuchar 3 veces un documento sonoro con diez extractos (1-10), que deberás relacionar con cada una de las diez preguntas (A-L), según lo que dice la grabación.
