

ORAL TEST INSTRUCTIONS

- This oral test consists of **two parts**: Task 1 (MONOLOGUE) and Task 2 (DIALOGUE).
- You have about **twenty minutes** to prepare for the test (Task 1 and Task 2).
- You can take notes to help you, but you can't use them during the exam.

Task 1 MONOLOGUE

- In this part you have to **talk for about 2 or 3 minutes** about the topic suggested.
- Use the ideas on the card to help you.
- After you finish your talk, be ready to answer your partner's questions about the same topic.
- When your partner is talking, listen carefully. Ask some questions about his/ her talk at the end.
- Candidate A starts.

- In this part you are expected to talk to your partner about the topic suggested.
- You must **interact** with him/ her as much as possible.
- Use the ideas on the card to help you.
- Candidate B starts.
