## **HOW TO MAKE FASTER DECISIONS**

Patrick McGinnis gives advice on overcoming FOBO (Fear Of a Better Option)

Nowadays, our world includes	<b>✓</b>
Just to buy a simple object, you have to sort through tons of items, reviews and that is a/an [9] amount of information.	
Collecting and preserving a wide variety of options to choose from can be bad, and it seems counter[10].	
Making decisions, you first determine the stakes, which will give you information about your [11] strategy.	
With no-stakes and thousands of options, the consequences of choosing one are, basically, [12].	
Low-stakes decisions have consequences, although they are not earth [13].	
Along with outsourcing decision-making, you really need some [14] involved.	
When the stakes are high and decisions have long-term	
The nature of FOBO implies that, no matter what you choose, the [16] will be minor.
